Girls Entrepreneurship & Mālama 'Aina Springboard (GEMS) Program, a collaboration between 'Akahiao Nature Institute and St. Andrew's Schools, has been designed to cultivate leadership capabilities in young women to grow strong female leaders who have the capacities and dispositions to navigate, guide, and shape our dynamic world.

This nature immersion curriculum has an entrepreneurship focus and is designed to develop confidence and self-efficacy in young women. The program culminates with a design thinking workshop run by Meli James, a successful female entrepreneur.

Program participants are invited to Huehue Ranch on the Big Island, Hawai'i, a microcosm of the world where students can access an understanding of global issues through an intimate exploration of the local landscapes.

#### Participants will:

- Explore themselves and their capabilities, passions and how their values align with their purpose
- Visit inspiring local social enterprises
- Learn to cook with ingredients from the garden. This teaches important lessons on systems thinking based on permaculture principles
- Build life skills that foster the attitudes and the mindsets that will be useful for living a purposeful life
- Build resiliency, self-efficacy, and courage through a challenging hike up Pu'u Wa'awa'a
- Create a vision of the future and design a pathway with concrete steps to get there

# THIS NATURE IMMERSION CURRICULUM HAS AN ENTREPRENEURSHIP FOCUS AND IS DESIGNED TO DEVELOP CONFIDENCE AND SELF-EFFICACY IN YOUNG WOMEN

Located on the Western slope of Hualalai on the Big Island of Hawai'i, **Huehue Ranch** was established in 1886 by Avery John Maguire as one of the three oldest and largest ranches in Hawaii. With the changing of times and under the direction of the current owner, the ranch has been converted into an experiential learning center for ecological designs and environmental leadership. The vision is to be a model for the future—a place where people and nature live as one and take care of each other in a mutually beneficial way. A sanctuary for those who want to escape modern society and reestablish confidence that our world can run on different values—love and respect for one another, a deep connection with the natural world, gratitude for this beautiful world we are in, and the spirit of collaboration.

Our lush, biodynamic garden has been created by our master landscape artist, converting rocky trampled earth into fertile soil using organic matter found right on the property. Designed for human-nature integration, a walk through the garden is an adventure full of discovery, wonder and sizzling engagement.

Akahiao is currently working to become accredited by the American Camp Association and anticipates completing the process in 2019.
